The ISOS-BreastGlobal Masterclass 'Enhance Your Skills: Autologous Breast Reconstruction' was held on the 12th of January 2024.


About BreastGlobal



The purpose of this module is to bridge the gap between clinical practice and






Ms. Laleh Busheri was invited for a virtual Breast Cancer Awareness Talk by the Innerwheel Club of Khadki, Pune.

On the 22nd of January, Innerwheel Club of Khadki invited Ms. Laleh Busheri for a virtual talk on Breast Cancer Awareness. Ms. Busheri's presentation was titled "From Awareness to Action: A Comprehensive Guide to Understanding, Preventing, and Conquering Breast Disease." Her talk highlighted breast cancer in an Indian context, the preventable risk factors, how to conduct a self-breast examination, the gold standard for treatment, and the use of breast oncoplasty. She also debunked common myths surrounding breast cancer. The presentation was well-received.

RESEARCH UPDATES: BIOBANK

Biobank is a repository where biological samples that facilitate research studies are conserved and stored, we specifically have breast tissue biobank- Formalin-Fixed and Paraffin-Embedded (FFPE) and Fresh Frozen (FF).



Formalin-Fixed Paraffin-Embedded (FFPE)

FFPE is a way of preservation of tissue samples in a paraffin block. FFPE blocks can be stored up to 12 years at ambient temperature and used for research purposes. With patient consent, we collect both biopsy and surgery blocks for the biobank. Currently the biobank houses over 1500 FFPE blocks.

Fresh Frozen (FF)

The fresh frozen breast tissue biobank was established to facilitate genomics and proteomics studies. The 'Fresh Frozen' Biobank collects consented fresh frozen breast tissue samples from Tru cut biopsy and VAB procedures. Over 100 samples collected till date.



MULTISEED CRACKERS



Health Benefits

- Multiseed crackers are energyrich healthy snacks packed with good fats and fibre.
- Flaxseeds are rich in Omega 3 fatty acids that have cancer preventive properties, while sesame seeds are rich in calcium and reduce the chances of osteopenia during hormonal therapy in breast cancer.
- These bite-size energy crisps can also help relieve tiredness and fatigue due to cancer treatment.
- They are a great way to relieve chemotherapy-induced nausea.
- Additionally, they can be made and stored for up to 15 days, which makes it convenient for the caregiver and the patient.



Ingredients

Flaxseeds 2 tbsp Chia seeds ltbsp Sesame seeds 1 tbsp Pumpkin seeds ltbsp 1 cup (30g) Besan Olive oil 2tsp 100-120ml Water Baking soda 1 pinch Chilliflakes, Salt, Oregano.



Method of Preparation

- Mix all dry ingredients, add olive oil and water and set aside for 10 minutes
- Pre heat oven at 180C.
- Pour the mixture on butter paper, place another paper on top and roll using a rolling pin.
- Remove the top sheet and shift the butter paper with mixture on baking tray.
- Bake for 15-20 minutes till golden brown
- Let it cool.
- Have it alone or serve with hummus dip!
