3) <u>ARTICLE ON NEW PARADIGM IN BREAST CANCER</u> <u>TREATMENT IN INDIA TODAY: DR. KOPPIKER</u>

An article by Dr. Koppiker on New Paradigm in Breast Cancer Treatment was published on 08 Jan 2018 in India Today Magazine.





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New Paradigm in Breast Cancer Treatment

Preast cancer in India is amongst the most common cancers in India and is seen more and more in the younger women below 45 yrs of age With the pathbreaking advances in medical science, there has been a paradigm shift in treatment of Breast Cancer. There has been a steady change in breast cancer management, with a change in focus from major surgeries, longer chemotherapy and radiation to optimizing personalized treatment. The current shift of focus reveals the importance and impact of empathy in designing a comprehensive treatment plan.

We use sophisticated imaging modalities like Digital Mammography with 3D Tomosynthesis and Automated Breast Volume Scanner, to diagnose the tiniest of tumors making them highly curable. Unlike in the earlier days, open surgical biopsy is becoming obsolete and using core needle biopsy - thin needle used under local anesthesia - has become the gold-standard. Further, advanced biopsy techniques like Vacuum-assisted Biopsy and Robotic arm-guided Stereotactic biopsy have immensely improved the accuracy of diagnosis while curtailing the discomfort to the patient. These procedures are scar-less, painless and can be performed within 15 minutes under local anæsthesia in an outpatient setting, obviating the need for expensive hospital stays. Such highly accurate technological advances are revolutionising the cancer diagnostics and surgical practices all over the world.

A common misconception is that when a woman is diagnosed with breast cancer, she will have to get her breasts surgically removed (i.e.,



mastectomy). This however is not true. "Global trends in breast cancer surgery have shifted from mastectomy to breast conservation with a paradigm shift towards Oncoplastic Breast Surgery (OBS)".

Mastectomy leaves a woman feeling mutilated which severely impacts her quality of life by affecting her body image, self-esteem and sexuality. Over the last three decades, breast conservation has become standard practice globally. Recent introduction of Oncoplastic surgery which combines principles of plastic surgery with those of cancer surgery has been found to positively impact women by making them look younger, and in better shape after treatment for breast cancer, thus adding a new dimension to their quality of life! Some women who do require mastectomy are given immediate reconstruction with such finesse that ensures that the breasts look better after reconstruction. This surgery is done at the same sitting so that women do not have to go made the while for a record time.

In addition to maintaining their sexuality and the sense of being complete, these techniques also help to prevent depression and sense of loss and incompleteness in women. They have also been shown to address negative issues related to the partner's psyche and reduces marital problems. Importantly, this type of surgery can also be used as a risk-reducing strategy for preventing cancer risk in asymptomatic women with a strong family history. We have a genetic and preventive program and have done several bilateral mastectomies and employ several other strategies for prevention of breast cancer.

Over the last decade, my team at Orchids Breast Health Clinic (OBHC) have performed over 5000 breast surgeries, 2000 oncoplastic surgeries with over 300 breast reconstructions and 150 therapeutic mammoplasties. Therapeutic mammoplasties is done for women with breast cancer and with large droopy breasts where-in we reduce and lift the breast in the same surgery while dealing with breast cancer. This helps in dealing with the cancer more efficaciously as well as reducing the symptoms associated with large breasts (e.g. asymmetrical body posture, spine and back problems etc.). It also helps in reducing the side-effects of radiation to the breast which is a must after breast conservation surgery.

In June 2015, a research study was conducted at OBHC on 150 operated patients from the clinic and 93% patients reported to having a high level of satisfaction and 95% agreed to refer other women to opt for Oncoplastic Breast Surgery. Given the increasing popularity of Breast Oncoplastic surgery in India and the need for training aspiring breast surgeons, we have started a unique Breast Oncoplasty training program in Asia with the help of a University of East Anglia, UK who are global pioneers in this field.
